#### 2025 Stewardship - Dreaming God's Dream

"Dream God's dream, Holy Spirit, help us dream

Of a world where there is justice and where everyone is free

To build and grow and love and to simply have enough

The world will change when we dream God's dream."



The Rev. Bryan Sirchio originally wrote "Dream God's Dream" for a youth retreat in 1991. The life and work of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King inspired the lyrics. Bryan observes, "I wanted to remind the youth that Martin's 'dream' was actually God's dream. And that's where this song really came from. The challenge of course is for us all to do what's ours to do to make sure that the 'Dream' doesn't just remain a dream. It needs to become reality, and the way that happens is in and through the lives of those who have been touched and energized and committed to the Spirit who gave birth to the Dream in the first place."

Artist Adrian Sanchez, currently incarcerated in a California Institution for Men, created the "Process of Life" (cover image) as part of an arts program funded by a local congregation. He reflects, "I believe that our young ones begin life with innocent hearts. I have learned that there are better ways to do things without violence. We artists were asked to imagine what

a city of compassion would look like and how the people there could cooperate so that everyone would have enough food. The Process of Life shows that there is pride and hope in carrying out positive ways of thinking about things like this."

Sanchez' art reminds us of the power of dreams – that the chick can become the rooster, that the whisper of the Spirit can become a movement for transformation, that no gift is too small to help make God's Dream a reality.

This year our stewardship campaign will be highlighted in worship by testimonials on *Sunday, October 19* and culminate on *Sunday, October 26*. Estimate of Giving Cards will be mailed to households with the request to return them on or before October 26.

Please prayerfully consider, "How can I cooperate with others to help make God's Dream

#### **Courageous Conversations October 21**



<u>Joplin Photo ID Project</u> assisted 12 people in September of 2025. One day no clients came in, which is unusual, and one day the Salvation Army HQ was closed due to staffing issues. Obtaining birth certificates continues to be a challenge as many clients arrive with no documentation of their identity. Primarily a result of being homeless and consequently vulnerable to theft and loss of their existing documents. The Joplin group has been invited by Missouri ID Access Coalition to a panel at the yearly summit in St Louis. It will be attended by Paul Teverow as a Subgrantee representative as most of the Joplin Photo ID funding comes from grants from the Ashrei Foundation.
